GENERAL INFORMATION

1. One of the philosophies of Twirling Unlimited is that there is too much unnecessary publicity by individual twirlers. This results in distrust by the media and a hohum attitude on the part of the public when a truly outstanding honor is achieved. In keeping with this, ALL the publicity concerned with Twirling Unlimited Regional Competition will be handled through our headquarters. Each contestant winning 1st place and each group winning 1st place will be given official press releases. These in turn are to be submitted to their local media – newspapers, radio, etc. No publicity relating to TU contests is to be submitted in any way other than the official press releases. Failure to comply with this standard will result in rejection of future entries and participation in Twirling Unlimited competitions.
2. Twirling Unlimited door admission:
\$5.00 for adults; \$3.00 for children 12 & under and senior citizens.
3. The term “Regional” does not denote a geographic restriction. Contestants from any location or any organization are welcome to participate.
4. Lanes for all Regional and Open events will be posted. It is the obligation of each twirler to report to each lane if you have a conflict. No changing of position in the Regional competition will be allowed.
5. Awards for all open events will be presented immediately. Pageant and Regional results announced as Tabulation is completed.
6. Building owner, contest director, Twirling Unlimited or contest sponsor are not responsible for accidents, property loss or injuries.
7. In order to be eligible to compete in any pageant, a twirler must also enter at least one “non-pageant” solo (either Regional, State or open solo).

MISS TU REGIONAL MAJORETTE (Including SENIOR division!)

Divisions: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15-17, 18+. Use your age as of day of contest.
(This is a “multi-status” event: open to any twirling level)

Note: The designation “Regional” does not restrict the contestants who may enter.

Regional events are open to twirlers from any location and any organization.

This is a three- part contest.

A. MODELING

All divisions optional attire: dress or costume –Time Limit: Max 1 ½ minutes
50% Model, 50% interview

B. COMPETITION SOLO

One baton only – time limit 1 ½ to 2 ½ minutes
Performed to standard march record

C. SHOW ROUTINE or SOLO DANCE TWIRL

Performed to music of contestant’s choice. Any type of twirl with
dance moves are permitted. Novelties optional. Time limit is 1½ to 2 ½
minutes. Timing will begin and end with the music. (Please bring your own
player or speaker in case of technical difficulties with music.)

Contestants must complete in all 3 aspects of this competition and the winner
will be determined using equal credit for all 3 parts.

Awards: 1-3 Trophies, TU Regional Majorette winners also receive flowers, banner
and \$25 for purchase of a Savings Bond, Individual medallions for 1-3 in Model,
Solo, Show *Note: Contestants must enter at least one “non-pageant” solo
(open, Regional or State) to be eligible to enter any pageant*

STATE SOLO CHAMPIONSHIPS (FLORIDA)

Open to Florida residents only. Time limit is 1½ to 2½ minutes from
salute to salute. Divisions: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & over

REGIONAL SOLO

Note: *The designation “Regional” does not restrict the contestants who may enter,
they may be from any organization and live in any location.*

Individual Ages for Preliminaries! Divisions: 0-6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16,
17, 18,19,20 & over. The top 2 in each age category will retwirl for the Regional
title: Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15-17, 18+. Awards: Trophy for 1st place in each
preliminary age group. Trophy for 1st, 2nd & 3rd in twirl-off. Flowers & banner
for Regional title winners.

REGIONAL FANCY STRUT

No specific pattern required – time limit is 2 minutes maximum.

Divisions: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over

REGIONAL TWO-BATON & REGIONAL THREE-BATON

2 Baton Time limit is 1½ to 2 minutes. Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over

3 Baton Time limit: ½ - 2 minutes Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over

REGIONAL DUET TWIRL

March Music; Time: 1½ to 2 ½ min. – Ages (Avg.): 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over

REGIONAL DUET STRUT

Use Own Music; Time: 1 to 3 min. – Ages (Avg.): 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+

REGIONAL PARADE MARCH

March Music; One baton; Time: Max 1 min. – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+

BEGINNER (Level 3) & INTERMEDIATE (Level 4) PAGEANTS

Divisions: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over.

Contestants will compete in Model (dress or costume allowed), Solo Twirl, & Fancy
Strut. Open to all contestants regardless of geographic residence. Banner, Trophy &
Flowers for winners. 3 place awards in model, twirl & strut. 3 places for overall
pageant winners. 4th & 5th place if more than 15 contestants. *Note: Contestants must
enter at least one “non-pageant” solo to be eligible to enter any pageant.*

BASIC SKILLS PAGEANT

Restricted to Level 1 and Level 2 (Sp. Beginner & Novice) twirlers ONLY.

Contestants compete in Basic March, Costume Model & Solo – 3 place awards in
Basic March, Solo and Costume Model. 3 places overall. 4th & 5th overall for groups
with 15 or more. Divisions: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+ *Note: Contestants must enter at
least one “non-pageant” solo (open, state or Reg.) to be eligible to enter the pageant.*

REGIONAL GROUP COMPETITION

*Note: Groups should bring your own player or speaker as backup in case of technical
difficulties with music.*

AGES: Pee Wee (0-6.9); Tiny Tot (7.0-8.9); Juvenile (9.0-11.9);
Junior (12.0-14.9); Senior (15 & Up)

Street Parade Corps – do a U formation; 2 minute time limit

Mini Corps – 2 to 4 minute time limit; no formation required

Floor Corps – 5 to 9 minute time limit

Production/Halftime – 10 member minimum; 5-9 minute time limit

Team Sizes for all events:

Small (3-5 members); Medium (6-9 members); Large (10+ members)

Dance Twirl Teams Use own music; 1 baton only, Time: 1 ½ - 3 minutes

Twirl Teams– standard march music; 1½ -3 min.

Strut Teams – Use own music, 1 baton. Time: 1- 3 minutes

Pom Teams – Use own music, 1½ - 3 minutes

Novelty Teams – (must use some equipment other than or in addition to one
baton) - use own music; Time: 1½ - 3 min.

Dance Lines (All types of dance) - Same sizes as Team events; Time: 1½ -3 minutes

Open Group Event:

Level 1 Dance Twirl Teams. For new and developing teams – Level of tricks
restricted: no member may do more than a 1 turn/ 2 elbows/No high toss tricks with
illusions or any gymnastics underneath. Awards: Level 1 medallions for ea. member

INDIVIDUAL OPEN EVENTS

Beg., Dress Model –Ages: 0-6, 7-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+ - length of dress is optional
Int. & Adv. Dress Model – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+ Time: 1½ min. Max.

Beg. Costume Model (Best Appearing) - Ages: 0-6, 7-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over
Int. & Adv. Costume Model (Best Appearing) – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+
With or without a baton – Time: 1½ minutes Max.

Novice, Beg. & Int. Fancy Strut – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+
No specific pattern required. Time: 2 minutes maximum

Beginner Basic March - Ages: 0-6, 7-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+
Advanced Basic March – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+
Marching performed in a square

Beg. & Adv. Military March – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+
Marching performed in a square with military beat of baton

NOTE: TU rules limit the number of toss turns and rolls which may be executed by twirlers in the developmental levels of solo twirl. Check TU rules for specifics.

Girls Solo Ages: 0-6, 7-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+

Level 1 (Special Beginner) Solo – has not won TWO 1st places in solo competition –
time limit is 1 to 2 minutes. No more than 1 spin/ 2 elbows/No high toss illusion

Level 2 (Novice) Solo - not won 3 additional first places in solo –
time limit is 1 ½ to 2 minutes No more than 2 spins/ 4 elbows

Level 3 (Beginner) Solo -not won 5 additional first places in solo Time: 1 ½ to 2 min
No more than 3 spins/ 6 elbows.

Level 4 (Intermediate) Solo - not won 8 add'l 1st places in solo Time 1 ½ to 2 ¼ min.
No more than 4 spins/ 8 elbows

Level 5 (Advanced) Solo - Time limit is 2 to 2 ½ minutes. No restrictions

Boys/Mens Solo – Time 1 ½ - 2 ½ minutes; Ages 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15+

Feature Twirler Solo –Open to ANY twirler age 15+ – Standard March Music –
Combination of 1 baton and any novelty.
Time: 2 – 2 ½ minutes – 1 baton minimum of 1 minute

Beg. & Int. Two-Baton - Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over (Time: 1½ to 2 min.)

Beg. Three-Baton – Ages: 0-8, 9-11, 12-14, 15 & Over (Time: ½ - 2 minutes)

Beginner Duet Twirl – Ages(Avg.): 0-8.5, 9-11.5, 12-14.5, 15+ Time: 1½ to 2 min.
