
ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- Camp Fee includes ALL instruction, as well as meals, housing, camp t-shirt and camp photo
- We accept campers of any age. Campers under 5, or boys, accepted as Day Campers only.
- Housing: All campers are housed in air-conditioned college dorm rooms for 2 people. Campers bring their own bedding.
- Health Information: Upon receipt of down payment, campers will receive a health certificate to be completed by the parent or family doctor. A physical is NOT required.
- Day Campers: Students or teachers may elect to attend camp only during the day. Day campers should plan to report by 8:15a.m. and will be done at approximately 3:00. The pre-paid day camp fee includes lunch. T-shirt not included, but may be purchased separately
- Parent Day Camp: Parents of day campers may elect to stay on campus. The \$25 cost includes lunch and parent class, but not twirling class observation.

PARENTS— You are invited to stay at the camp for a delightful vacation. Parent price includes all meals and housing, AND the parent class! No twirling classes included in this price.

TEACHERS—You are invited to register as a full-time or Day camper. The teacher rate includes full access to twirling classes—and you may rotate through classes to maximize the amount of material you learn. You may videotape any class material from all camp classes. Any teacher bringing 9 or more campers may attend camp FREE.

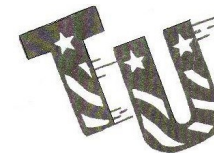

PFP (Practice for Perfection) in University fieldhouse with high ceiling! Campers who are interested in preparing for summer national competition can choose to do PFP classes in the afternoon, which will focus on practicing details of existing routines to improve competition performances.

Simulated Competition Experience: each camper has an opportunity to perform one event for a certified judge - with a score sheet and feedback comments. One SCE included in camp registration; campers may choose to purchase one additional SCE, if they wish.

SCHEDULE:

Campers should plan to report on Friday between 8:00 and 10:00 am. Campers will check in and receive a room assignment; classes will begin at 10:30

- 6:00—Supervised Practice
- 6:30—Performance of daily material
- 7:30—Evening Group Class (Pom, dance or Fire Baton)
- 8:30—Social Time
- 10:00—Lights Out

There is a performance for parents and friends at 3:00 on Sunday. It will last 30- 45 minutes and is presented entirely from material taught at camp. See what your daughters have learned! Parents should arrive between 1:00 & 2:00 on Sunday to load cars, etc. so they will be ready to leave camp right after the performance.

EXTRA EVENTS:

- PARENT CLASS! This class will be offered one afternoon and is available free of charge for any parent registered as a camper. However, ANY parent may participate, for an additional fee. Sample topics are: A walk through a competition day, Psychology of supportive parenting, What judges are looking for—and more.
- DO YOU WANT TO BE A JUDGE? This class will be offered one afternoon and is available to any camper age 15 or over. Learn the view from “behind the table” - what the judge is looking for, what a “master sheet” is, how judges score. Apply the information to your current performances—and find out if becoming a certified judge is in your future.
